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In Memoriam



Raphael Gallagher, C.Ss.R.
10.10.1943 - 03.12.2024
Professor of the Alphonsian Academy

Together with the Dublin Province, the Alphonsian Academy mourns the death of a former colleague, Fr. Raphael Gallagher. Fr. Gallagher was a professor in the Academy from 1994-2014, where he taught systematic moral theology. He spent his last years in the Redemptorist community Dundalk, Ireland. He died after a brief illness in the Mater Hospital in Dublin at the age of 81.

Fr. Gallagher was born in a small town called Bailleborough, in Co. Cavan on the 10th of October 1943. At that time the Redemptorists had a flourishing “juvenile” in Limerick where Raphael was educated from 1955 to 1960. He then did an Arts Degree at Galway University. His philosophy and theology studies followed in Galway and Dublin, leading to his ordination in 1969. After two years of ministry in Ireland he was sent to the Alphonsian Academy where he completed his licence in 1973. His doctoral studies took him to Germany and France where he perfected his modern languages. He wrote his thesis in Rome on the scientific status of moral theology with another Irish Re-

demptorist, Fr. Sean O’Riordan. Having completed his doctoral thesis in 1977, Fr. Gallagher taught in various faculties in Ireland for a period of ten years, apart from one year as an invited professor in the USA. His academic career was interrupted between 1987 and 1993 when he served as Provincial Superior of the Dublin Province. In 1994 he came to the Alphonsian Academy as a professor where he remained until 2014. During this period he was also Secretary of the Commission for *Studia Moralia* for six years.

It is as a professor here in the Academy that Raphael Gallagher is kindly remembered by students and colleagues. During his years here he accompanied a large number of students in the preparation of their theses. He was notoriously meticulous and diligent in this work, but he also showed great patience and kindness when students were in difficulty. These human qualities were accompanied by an intense intellectual curiosity as well as a strong pastoral sense. This fact finds happy expression in his last major publication, a translation of the tract on conscience in St. Alphonsus.

To these biographical facts allow me to add a brief personal appreciation. Raphael was in turn my professor, my prefect and my provincial before becoming a colleague here in the Academy. I can honestly say that not a single cross word passed between us in well over 20 years of contact. Although I personally did not do my doctorate with him, his most admirable quality in my mind was his professionalism and “humanitarianism” when dealing with doctoral students.

Like others here, I am aware that through this and other services, he made a very significant contribution to the international reputation of the Alphonsian Academy. For this we are and will always remain truly grateful to him and to God. May he rest in peace...
